Who are the Careers Enterprise Company?

The Careers & Enterprise Company (CEC) is England's national body for careers education, working with schools, colleges, and employers to improve provision in line with the Gatsby Benchmarks, including their 2025 updates. CEC supports Careers Leaders through accredited training (nearly 4,000 trained since 2019), connects education providers with employers through 44 co-funded Careers Hubs covering 94% of institutions, and provides tools, data, and resources to strengthen practice. Its data from over 233,000 students and 900 employers helps measure impact, focusing on employer outreach, student career readiness, and school and college improvement. Careers provision, including for SEND learners, has improved nationally—SEND institutions perform particularly well in providing workplace experiences, especially when part of a Careers Hub.

4JD visit the Saints Stadium

On Monday 13th October, Class 4JD visited St Mary's Stadium, home of Southampton FC, to take part in a careers event run by the Saints Foundation. Throughout the day, students took part in workshops exploring key employability skills, practised techniques for specific job roles, and gained a fascinating insight into how a professional football club operates.

Activities included learning how to "dress to impress," practising interview techniques, and exploring careers in retail and hospitality. Students also developed teamwork and critical thinking skills before enjoying a behind-the-scenes tour of the stadium, visiting the VIP restaurant, announcer's box, and both dressing rooms to learn about the psychology of competitive sport. Their behaviour and engagement were excellent, and the Saints Foundation staff shared glowing feedback about the group.
