What should we do with the money we have to improve outside activities?

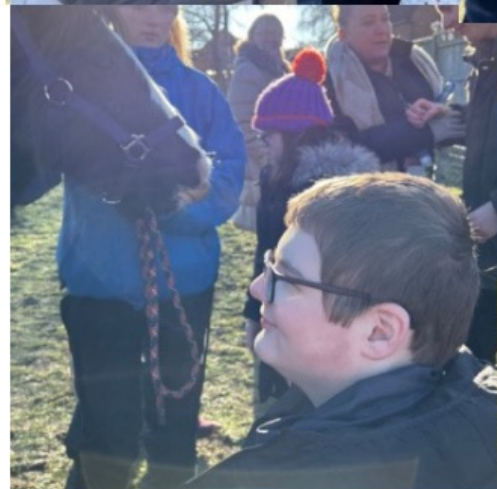

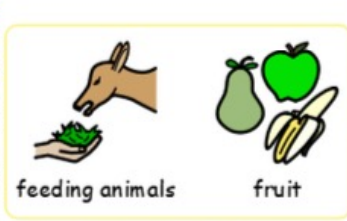
Diary Dates

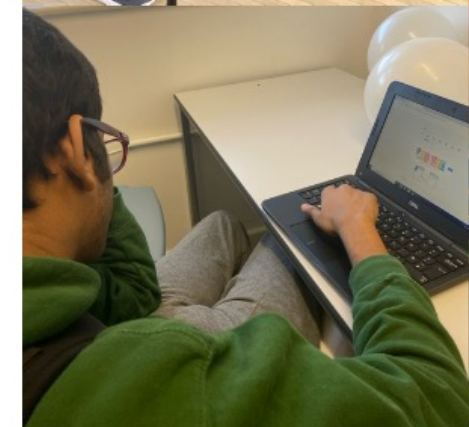
