We are also looking into a cosy book corner where students will be able to choose books and sit and talk in a calm space.

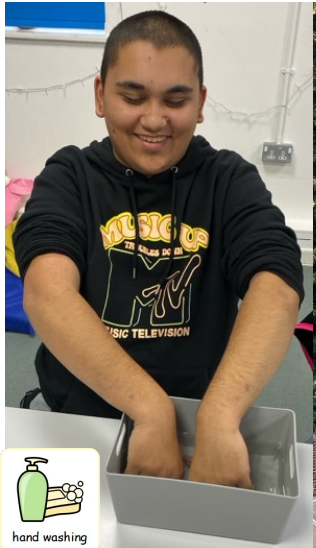
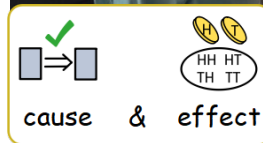
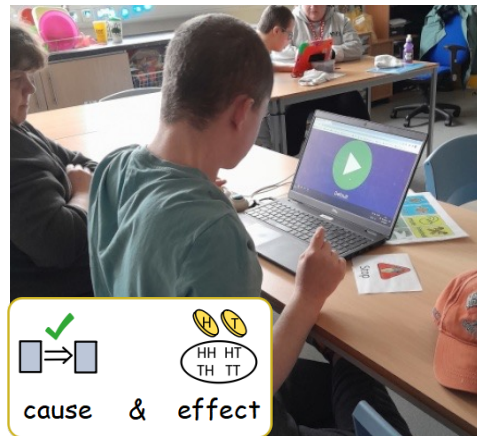
Hopefully when the transformations are complete, I will be able to share photographs of them being used.

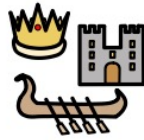

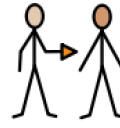
