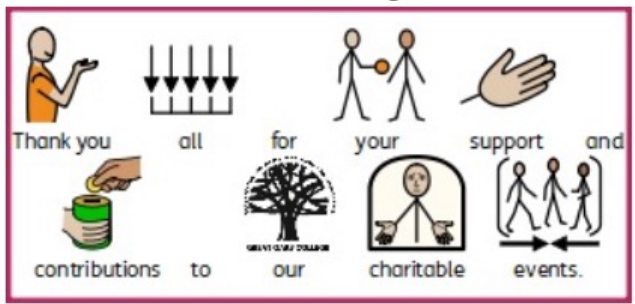

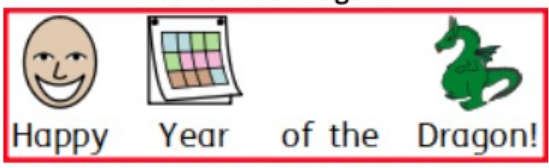
Kate's Corner

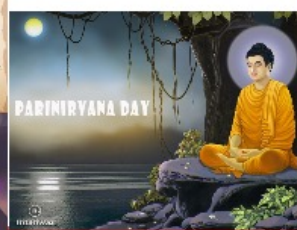
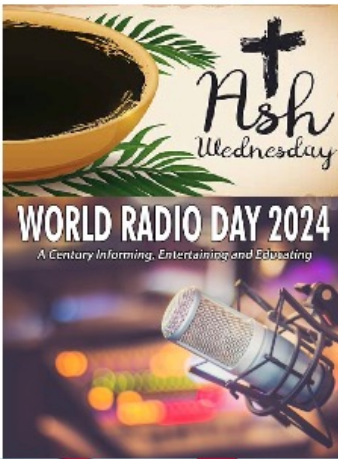
